



KOWAS HUNTING SAFARIS: Things to remember: CHECK LIST

- Inoculations: Hepatitis A + B, Tetanus
No malaria in the Kowas hunting territory.
- Passport
- Passport copy
- Register your rifles with US Customs. Obtain Form 4457 (Max. 2 guns, no semi or automatic rifles).
Keep registration with you when leaving the USA.
- Notify your bank and credit card company in advance that you'll be traveling to Africa (so they do expect foreign transactions from your credit card).
- Order Travelers cheques in advance.
- Know the PIN of your credit card. This is needed to withdraw cash from an ATM.
- Obtain trip cancellation insurance from the time of booking.
- Activate your travel insurance. (www.globalrescue.com or www.medjetassistance.com)
- Insure your guns and equipment. (www.siai.net)
- Check your passport expiration date. You need:
 - 11 months beyond your return date;
 - two blank consecutive pages open for stamps.
- Plane tickets / itinerary
- Travel agent contact details.
- Outfitters correspondence, quotation, receipt
- Your USA taxidermist / or clearing agent contact details.
- Rifles and ammo. 60 Rounds per gun would be enough.
- Binoculars
- Cameras, video recorder, batteries for all equipment, chargers, cables
- Laptop, cables, chargers
- Toiletries
- Medicine & Prescriptions: We advise to bring along a copy of your prescription if you use prescription medication – you never know when it would be necessary to use it.
- Hunting boots: 1 pair, well worn.



- Hunting clothes: 2 pairs. Camo's are allowed in Namibia, but not to travel with. Only in the hunting field. If you prefer shorts, we recommend the zip-off pants. However, trousers is recommended due to the tall, sour grass. Remember that we have daily laundry service!
- Casual wear for around the campfire.
- 1 Heavy jacket. We recommend layering your clothes. Morning and evenings cool.
- Gloves, ear muffs, sun hat/cap
- Flash light / batteries
- Have our physical address and contact telephone number with you upon arrival. You'll need it to fill out the arrival form upon arrival in Namibia. Have a pen handy, you would need to fill out the form upon arrival.
- Pack ammo separate from rifles, in:
 - original factory boxes,
 - in "locked metal container" like a Cash Box from Wall Mart – some airlines require this.
- Books to read on the plane/at the lodge.
- Diary, pen, note paper.
- Mark your bags with 2 tags. Add a ribbon/identification tape on it (to recognize your baggage on the carousel). Place your itinerary with contact details on top, inside your luggage, in case it gets lost.
- Did you provide us with your itinerary?
- Did you leave our contact details with your loved ones?
- Did you provide the contact details of your loved ones to us?
